

Climate risk is becoming more pronounced around the world with extreme events and natural catastrophes such as droughts, heat waves, floods, being more frequent. Europe is among the fastest warming continents in the world, while Eastern and Southern Europe are among the most vulnerable regions on the continent. Countries in the region face heightened exposure to the risk of heat and water stress compared to other EU countries. At the same time, the CEE region is the least insured. The European Insurance and Occupational Pensions Authority (EIOPA) ranks Bulgaria, Romania and Greece with the highest risk exposure in terms of protection gap between vulnerability and insurance coverage.

Addressing climate risk from both physical and financial perspectives in Central & Eastern Europe will be critical for the region, but also for the needed reforms within the global financial architecture. The event will focus on sharing knowledge, experience and discussing the necessary policies and practices in the region, within Europe and globally. It will be a good opportunity to discuss exposure and vulnerabilities to climate change alongside viable policies and practices.

## <u>Environmental Protection and Rehabilitation of the Black</u> Sea

#### **Annotation**

Owing to natural factors, the diversity of species of Black Sea fauna is approximately three times lower when compared with that of the Mediterranean. Specific features of the Black Sea make it very vulnerable to disturbances of its environment and ecosystems. Eutrophication, pollution, and irresponsible fishing resulted in an overall decline of: biological resources, the diversity of species and landscapes, and of the aesthetic and recreational values of the Black Sea, thereby bringing its ecosystems to the edge of collapse.

National efforts and regional - international cooperation in the framework of the Convention on the Protection of the Black Sea Against Pollution expressed in the concerted actions of the Strategic Action Plan for Rehabilitation and Protection of the Black Sea brought the first signs of recovery to the Black Sea.
