After careful consideration of the provided information in the notification of the project and consultations with the competent authorities in our country, it was concluded that given the nature of the project activities (completion of already built projects) and the remoteness of the project location (approximately 165 km from the Bulgarian border), there is no possibility of a transboundary environmental impact on Bulgaria, including a significant impact on the Danube Water Body, shared by Bulgaria and Romania, nor a health risk for the Bulgarian population from the Project on "Increasing the share of electricity generation from renewable sources by completing the works and ensuring permanent monitoring of the environmental impact at Cerna-Motru-Tismana Hydrotechnical an Energy Complex, Second Stage", Romania
